Lesson 22 – Financing the Church – Tithing Part 2 (OUTLINE)

I. In his book Why Every Christian Should Tithe, B.H. Hillard gave a summary of Malachi 3:8-12 as follows.

- A. Scriptural "Bring ye all the tithing." God has never relinquished His claim to the tithe as the minimum of one's gift.
- B. Simple "bring." Just as simple as coming to church; bringing the tithe just as a parent brings the child. To "bring" implies a complete control, coercive subjugation.
- C. Serviceable "Into the storehouse." The church is God's storehouse, into which ALL the tithe is to be brought; none of which is to be diverted through extraneous channels. Serviceable also implies any tithe is to be in top-notch condition and usability.
- D. Sufficient "That there may be meat in mine house." "Meat means sufficiency." God says the tithe will be sufficient for every need. And, wherein, under any circumstances, the tithe did fail to meet the requirements God will make provision for that which is lacking.
- E. Sublime "Prove me now herewith." "Prove me" means to give God a chance. To use a slang expression, it means "to put your God on the spot. It is accepting God's challenge. [the sublime is the quality of greatness, whether physical, moral, intellectual, metaphysical, aesthetic, spiritual, or artistic. The term especially refers to a greatness beyond all possibility of calculation, measurement, or imitation.]
- F. Sensible "If I will not open unto you the windows of heaven, and pour you out a blessing, that there shall not be room to receive it."
 - 1. Common intelligence, coupled with faith, would lead one to tithe as the means of claiming such a promise.
 - 2. No person can believe this promise and fail to tithe.
- G. Satisfying "And all nations shall call ye blessed." It was doubtlessly tithers God has in mind in Philippians 4:19.

Malachi 3:8-12 ⁸Will a man rob God? Yet ye have robbed me. But ye say, Wherein have we robbed thee? In tithes and offerings. ⁹Ye are cursed with a curse: for ye have robbed me, even this whole nation. ¹⁰Bring ye all the tithes into the storehouse, that there may be meat in mine house, and prove me now herewith, saith the LORD of hosts, if I will not open you the windows of heaven, and pour you out a blessing, that there shall not be room enough to receive it. ¹¹And I will rebuke the devourer for your sakes, and he shall not destroy the fruits of your ground; neither shall your vine cast her fruit before the time in the field, saith the LORD of hosts. ¹²And all nations shall call you blessed: for ye shall be a delightsome land, saith the LORD of hosts.
